

## Research and Evaluation Summit

Conducted May 2009, San Antonio, TX  
Follow-Up as of October 13, 2009

### 1. Registries

- All known published articles that refer to HIPPY have been collected in hard copy form and put in a binder in the national office. A list of the articles is available from HIPPY USA and on the website.
- Eleven registries/organizations have been contacted for information. On the ones that HIPPY had the data/information to support the criteria, submission has been sent in. Response can take months. California Based Clearinghouse has raised our level to 2 instead of 4.

### 2. Publishing

- Eight authors of research were contacted to see if they would be willing to polish their articles for publication. Only one, Angela Nievar, is working on getting hers published.

### 3. Professional Appearance of Compilation of Research Summary

- Research Summary is available on HIPPY USA website. These are unpublished summaries of research on HIPPY programs.

### 4. Advisory Council/Research Team

- Dr. Bob Bradley could continue the longitudinal study. The cost is estimated at approximately \$60,000.
- Kim Boller with Mathematica has been contacted for research possibilities.
- Dr. Susan Perry and Dr. Elizabeth Vaughn-Neely with UALR are also possibilities to conduct research and/or serve on an advisory team.
- The costs from other researchers cannot be calculated until research data and timelines are identified.
- HIPPY USA's research proposal will be resubmitted to Senator Pryor in February to continue previous research with HIPPY programs and to examine the fidelity and quality of programs

### 5. Program Fidelity/MIS Data Overlay

- The system is under reconstruction. It is expected to debut in April 2010 at the National Conference.

### 6. Apply metrics/thresholds to the Logic Model, Home Visits, and Group Meetings (showing time spent on activity packets, role play, and number of group meetings and linking group meeting topics, home visit information and resources to state outcomes on scheduling and time management, to school and community connections, etc.)
